Free Tree from OG&E

Heritage Hills has received 32 Profusion Crabapple trees, as a result of a collaboration with OG&E.

This variety of tree is power line friendly, has a mature height of from 15 to 20 feet, with a width of 15 to 25 feet at maturity. We have been told that this variety is easy to grow and noted for its rounded shape, violet-red flowers, red fruit and good disease resistance. The trees are 2 to 4 feet in height, come in one gallon containers, and are very easy to plant.
